Official Whiffleball Rules:

Rule Changes Adopted by 2020 Vote:

- Roster spots have been increased to 26
- Keeper Selections have been increased to 5
- Games started by pitchers have been limited to 14 per week

Keepers:

We have a By Round - No Limit Hold 'Em System. The tenets of which are:

- A. You keep a player in the round that you drafted them the previous year, thus you give up that pick. So say you were me last year and picked Greinke in the 9th round, you could keep him as your 9th round pick this year.
- B. An owner can keep a player until he decides not to.
- C. If you have multiple #1's, they will be kept as your #1 & #2, etc. picks. They still all count as a #1 in subsequent years.
- D. After you have kept a player for one year, they become a Round PLUS FIVE keeper. Thus if you kept a 24th rounder in 2018, the next year (2019) if you keep them, they will be a 19th rounder, and for the next year they would be a 14th rounder. If they are a #2, they become a #1, etc.
- E. If through trades you want to keep 2 of the same round, one will be kept from that round and one from the round PRIOR. So 2 fourth rounders become third and fourth round keepers.
- F. If a player was not drafted (picked up as a free agent) and is kept as a keeper, he will be kept as a 20th round pick. (It takes less skill to pick up a rising star than to draft him in a late round... thus you don't get to have him as a 25th round pick... (but 20th is pretty good value anyway)
- G. If you fail to submit your keeper selections by the deadline, you forfeit your first draft pick (in practice, you must draft the lowest ranked player in the ESPN.com rankings).
- H. You must keep 5 keepers each season.

Keeper Trading Rules:

- Trading is allowed
- Trades can be worked in private and once agreed upon must be submitted to the Commish in writing
- The league will have an opportunity to review
- Only in cases where there is a majority of opposition is an override possible (at least 5 out of 8 parties not involved in the trade)
- The commissioner has the final say in disputes
- All players traded in keeper trading MUST be used as keepers by the receiving team (unless a pre-draft day severe injury occurs. The Commish ultimately decides if it is severe – guideline would be missing ½ season or more)
- The Keeper Trading deadline is 11:59pm 6 days prior to the draft to allow final approvals and finalization of keeper rosters

Draft Position:

For those that do not make the playoffs, your season is over. The draft order for the following year will be the order of finish for those that miss the playoffs. (7th picks 1st, 8th picks 2nd, etc.) ESPN's final standings listed will be used for tiebreakers.

For those who do make the playoffs, draft position will be a hybrid of your regular season finishing position and your playoff finishing position, with the exception of the champion who will pick last. The two values are added together for your combined position. If there is a tie then whoever finished worse in the playoffs will have the higher draft pick.

Points for MLB Opening Series in a Foreign Country

According to ESPN's FAQs any points scored in any early foreign (e.g. Australia, Japan, etc.) games will count in week 1 provided you draft the players into a starting position on your roster. If they are drafted onto your bench, you will not get the points.

Pick-ups During the Playoffs

If you are out of the playoffs, your season is over, you have nothing to play for. Do not grab guys that are on actual waivers. Playoff teams get the first opportunity to pick them up. If they make it to being free agents then everyone has had enough time to try to pick them up and you can position your team for next year by picking them up.

Replacing an Owner

If only one owner is being replaced in a season, then the new owner acquires the one vacant roster and may choose their keepers from that roster. In the draft itself, they will pick 10th.

If more than one owner is being replaced there are 2 options from which the commissioner can choose, based on the amount of time and other constraints related to the league calendar. There will either be an expansion draft or there will be a coin flip to determine which new owner is assigned which roster. The expansion draft will consist of all players from the vacated rosters. There will be a snake-style draft of players and they retain what round they are kept in. If determined by coin flip, the commissioner will flip the coin (with a witness) and assign accordingly.
